- Hands-on training in operating fire extinguishers
- Safety precautions when using fire extinguishers

Module 6: Communication and Coordination

- Effective communication during fire emergencies
- Role of Fire Wardens in coordinating evacuation efforts
- Conducting headcounts and accounting for personnel

Module 7: Emergency Response and Aftermath

- Responding to different types of fire emergencies
- First aid considerations for fire-related injuries
- Post-fire procedures and debriefing

- Responsibilities of employers, employees, and Fire Wardens
